The INTERCOM

The INTERCOM is the RMR family's newsletter, which originally started as "The Bugler" in 1914 on the troopship carrying the 14th Bn (RMR) overseas. Censorship quickly squashed the initiative, but the RMR tried again in 1916 with "The Growler" (which was also squashed!).

In WW2 the RMR had two battalions, one overseas from 1939-45, and a Home unit stationed in Westmount. In an effort to boost morale and keep the lines of communication open between the two battalions, the "Intercomn" ("n" intentional) was born.

The current "Intercom" is published on an ad-hoc basis and is intended to keep the friend & family of the Regiment up to speed with the accomplishments of the current serving members of the Regiment and all affiliated organizations.

- **04 November 2018:** Westmount Remembrance Day Parade commemorative service held at the cenotaph in Vimy Park by City Hall, begins at 14h00. The RMR and the RMR Association (Branch 14) will be marching in the parade.
- 10 November 2018: Mohawk Branch 219 annual Remembrance Day Parade, service held at the Kahnawake cenotaph (across from the Catholic church) at 13hoo. The RMR Association (Branch 14) will be marching in the parade.
- 11 November 2018: <u>City of Montreal Remembrance Day Parade</u>, service held at Place du Canada (corner René Lévesque and Metcalfe), beginning at 10h30. The RMR and the RMR Association (Branch 14) will be marching in the parade.
- **11 November 2018:** Dévernissage for the RMR Museum's special armistice exhibition *"War: Is It Over? The Challenge of Peace"*, held at Victoria Hall Gallery.

As well, RMR soldiers and veterans will be active promoting Remembrance at local schools, serving as guest speakers and helping with their commemorative services. A big **BRAVO to RSM Leroux** who has organized a massive Remembrance open house for the English Montreal School Board on 07 November 2018, to be held at the Cote-des-Neiges armoury, with more than 800 students expected to attend!
