The end of the year is a good time to reflect upon what has been accomplished in the previous year, as well as to evaluate the predictions of what would come. Well, so much for my bold statement made at the end of last year about a major project being the addition of our most recent theatre honour "AFGHANISTAN" to the RMR's memorial tablet. Upon closer inspection, the memorial tablet very clearly states that it is in memory of our "fallen", and given that we're fortunate that no RMR's were killed in the decade of fighting in Afghanistan, no update to the memorial tablet is required. The unit has made the formal request to update the Regimental Colour with the theatre honour, so stand by for a communication about that in the future.

Speaking of Afghanistan, the RMR Museum also put together an outstanding travelling exhibition about Afghanistan that used the video testimonial of many serving and former RMR's, and I hope you take the time to read about it (story in the links below). The exhibition was also used as the basis for the *Je Me Souviens* education program's latest materials.

As 2019 winds down, please take a moment to read this selection of the accomplishments of the RMR Family over the past year that are shown below. In the 40 different stories featured, there is a selection from the entire Regimental Family: the serving battalion, the RMR Association, the RMR Museum, and the <u>four</u> affiliated cadet units. I am honoured to be able to

serve the Regiment and the best part of my role is meeting with the bright minds who fill the ranks of all parts of the regimental family. The leadership displayed is breathtaking, be it from cadets or the serving battalion or the regimental association - strong leaders helping their teams accomplish great things together.

- The serving battalion of the Regiment is in good shape, recruiting is still the highest in the Brigade, the production of junior leaders is racing along, and solid training that is both challenging and relevant is being conducted. Physical fitness, strong battlecraft skills, and professional weapons handling are all the hallmarks of good infanteers and that's what is consistently being done by the serving battalion.
- The RMR Association used the opportunity of their 100th anniversary in 2019 to set a new record for fundraising during the annual poppy campaign. They were active in supporting the serving battalion and the community, in fact many of them will spend this evening helping out at the Ste-Anne's veterans hospital.
- We added a fourth cadet unit in 2019:<u>588 Eric Simms Air Cadet Squadron</u> was granted affiliation in October 2019, and will benefit from the RMR's experienced leaders. All of the RMR's affiliated cadet units are strong, some at all time highs in terms of attendance and more than 100 of their cadets were sent to summer camps in 2019.
- The RMR Museum is planning a complete physical makeover (renovation) in 2020 and is also looking for volunteers to assist with a major digital archiving project: Nearly 9,000 items have been digitized and will be available online by the end of 2020.

As we enter a new decade of service to Canada, please take a few moments to think of or utter a prayer for deployed RMR members and those of our regimental family who are battling illness or disease.

First Stand of Colours: 1919



RIP Colonel Hart

The Regiment lost a good friend in March 2019 when Honorary Colonel David Hart, MM, CD of the 34th Signals Regiment died at 101 years old.

He had been awarded the Military Medal for bravery on the battlefield as a young Sergeant at the battle of Dieppe in 1942 before being commissioned as an infantry officer.

He was the longest serving Honorary Colonel in the Canadian Army, and had been a good friend of the RMR since the early 1950's.



RMR Door Gunners


