Sand Lake origin of Name
The name may have originated
with early Dutch settlers. Their
frows often went to the shore of the
Lake now called "Crystal" to get Sand
for household use. They called the
lake "Sant Loe". The Dutch word
for Sand is Zand old spelling Zant,
and for lake it is Loef. The present
Dutch spelling would be Zand Loef.

The villages in our town were all known by names other than what they are called today.

The village of Taborton was known as East Sand Lake at first, then came Georgetown in Monor of George Horton, who was born there Sept. 20, 1792. Finally it was named Taborton, meaning promised land, the name we all know today.

Sand Lake village was known as Sliter's

Corners and received its name from the Sliter
family who were pioneer settlers there. Then
it was changed to Sand Lake.
