



ASTRONOMICAL CALCULATIONS.

ECLIPSES, 1883.

There will be four Eclipses this year, two of the Sun and two of the Moon, as follows:

I. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, April 22, visible on the Pacific Coast. Begins at San Francisco at 2:51 mo.; middle at 3:29 mo., and ends at 4:05 mo.

II. A total Eclipse of the Sun, May 7, invisible in U.S.

III. A Partial Eclipse of the Moon, Oct. 15-16, visible throughout the U.S.

IV. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, Oct. 30, visible on the Pacific Coast. The Eclipse, beginning at San Francisco at 3:40 p.m., the Sun sets with the Eclipse upon it.

MORNING STARS.

MERCURY, from Feb. 5 to April 16; June 7 to July 29, and Oct. 6 to Nov. 26. VENUS, from Sept. 20 to Sept. 29. MARS, until Nov. 1. JUPITER, until July 5, and after Oct. 27. SATURN, until May 20, and after Sept. 2. URANUS, from Sept. 16 to Dec. 20. NEPTUNE, from May 9 to Aug. 14.

EVENING STARS.

MERCURY, until April 5, and from April 16 to June 7; July 29 to Oct. 6, and after Nov. 26. VENUS, after Sept. 20. MARS, after May 1. JUPITER, until July 5, and after Oct. 27. SATURN, until May 20, and after Sept. 2. URANUS, until Sept. 16, and after Dec. 20. NEPTUNE, until May 9, and after Aug. 14.

PLANETS BRIGHTEST.

MERCURY, Jan. 10-22; May, 11-22; and Sept. 8-11; setting after the Sun. Also March 3-6; July 2-5, and Oct. 22-25; rising before the Sun. VENUS, Jan. 9. MARS and JUPITER, not this year. SATURN, Nov. 28. URANUS, March 12. NEPTUNE, Nov. 12.


