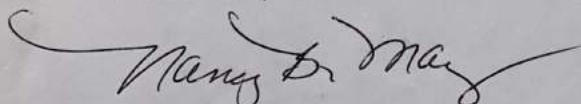
Dear Friends,

Clothing

- black vest with 12 covered buttons. (double)
Note in ~~box~~ box states: Vests of Antonio Roesch (c 1820) + Francis B Rush (Antonio's son) - note Americanization of name (c 1860)
- white vest with six buttons (single) with note (white vest - Mr Rush) but not sure which one
- vest cream colored background with tiny tan squares with six gold colored buttons
- one pair of black high top baby shoes with button-holes for 5 buttons. Left shoe has 3 buttons; right shoe has 2 buttons.
- red, white and navy blue child size top with note pinned to it
"waist ~~was~~ worn by Mr. Rush."
- cream colored vest with 4 white ceramic buttons held in place "like a key ring."
- cream colored canvas style material with 5 white ceramic buttons held in place "like a key ring."
- pleated "dickie" which fastened with button at neck and has one button for decoration and then fastens around the body.
- ruffled "dickie" fastened in the front with two buttons. Also has ~~two~~ four pleats and then fastens around the body
- skirt and top to underarms. Appears to be handsewn hem is scalloped and finished in fine blanket stitching. Skirt appears to be woolen with several holes (? moth eaten)
- Long infant dress ecru in color with label pinned on stating "Infant clothes worn by Mr Rush in 1843. ? tatted hem"
- Infant dress with very fine multiple pleats in bodice and skirt short sleeves with lace trim

Thank you for sending us the box of documents and clothing from the Samuel Rush family. We have done an itemized inventory of them.
