## Indian Tribal Names Suggested For Thruway

Indian tribal names would be used to designate various sections of the New York State Thruway under a bill approved by the Assembly and sent to the Senate. The measure is sponsored by Assemblyman Jerry W. Black.

The main stem of the Thruway from New York to Buffalo would be known as the Iroquois Trail.

The Erie Section, Cheektowaga to the Pennsylvania state line, would be the Erie Path.

The New England Section, New York City to the Connecticut state line would be the Mohican Path.

The Niagara Section, Cheektowaga to Niagara Falls, would be the Niagara Path.

The Berkshire Section, Beckers Corners, Albany County, through Rensselaer County to the Massachusetts boundary near the Massachusetts state line would be the Algonquin Path.

The Berkshire Section of the Thruway will be carried over the Hudson River on a new bridge and would then cross a portion of the southern section of Rensselaer County.

Blerot died in Moscow Monday. Four days of official mourning were proclaimed in Poland and chief, it added.

Other countries of the Soviet bloc are expected to attend the funeral speakers at a solemn ceremony in Warsaw Monday, the radio reported. The Moscow delegation is to be headed by Nikita Khrushchev, Soviet Communist Party Soviet Council of Unions.

## Prayers Planned To Ease Tension

Ministers in Protestant churches in Albany will offer prayers Sunday for the relief of racial troubles in the South.

The Albany Federation of Churches asked churchmen to pray "that the forces of reconciliation in the troubled south may be the strongest" and that "men of good will and understanding may . . . banish the fears and the animosities that now separate them."

Current racial tension was cited as a salient problem that was "but a particular reflection of the troubles and tensions of our world."
