Shrubs such as Eriogonum parvifolium, a common Buckwheat with pink and white balls of flowers. . .and shrubs such as the common <u>Baccaharis pilularis</u> var. <u>consanquinea</u>, Coyote Bush. Corecosis cicantea - a large wildflower plant, almost a shrub, its sturdy stalks in . candelabra-like form; from tufts of feathery filiform foliage slender stems extend brilliant

golden-yellow daisy flowers swaying in the breeze. The Oso Flaco Lake area of the Nipomo Dunes is the significant northernmost limit of this plant. Visit Coreopsis Hill early March.
