Located between Oceano and Point Sal, they are rated by the National Park Service as the most scenic sand dunes along the California coast.

Meeting place is on State Highway One along the coast, at the intersection of Oso Flaco Lake Road. This point is 13 miles south of Pismo Beach on Highway One.
