Sometime - before too much time goes by - if a trip to San Francisco is something you need to do, please allow an extra day, a whole real day, to go out to Pt. Reyes National Seashors and just poke into every part of it and see what has been done there - with wide open wind-blown marine terraces and little beaches and enclaves of charming dunes, and cliffs. The Nipomo Dunes has a more ecologically varied terrain and vegetation and is richer than Pt. Reyes. A very interesting inclusion of a lot of added territory north and south of the Nipomo Dunes could be worked out, just as Golden Gate National Recreation Area has done, including a network of communities and state parks - just as the vest Metional Trust parks system of England works out protection of whole districts (even including villages). I have a lot of data and maps if you ever want to see it.

Have you been to Oso flaco Lake lately? Such peace and quiet. It really is getting back to its feeling of being the wilderness it was originally and naturally. I call it a white and wind-sculptured wilderness, not forests with leagues of trees, but a world of dunes laced with green glades and graced with blue lakes - a wonderful world - for families, for people who need the solitude and the beauty - it is a healing place to go from the pressures of contemporary life. Please save Saturday, January 5th, 9 a.m. for the Annual Anniversary Dunes Walk of the Santa Lucia Chapter of the Sierra Club - a very pleasant excursion.
