Hello Madeleine. I am pleased to share these ink ball handles with you. I suggest you wrap the leather around the head and secure with cord rather than using tacks. The narrow section is intended as a space to tie the cord. If this doesn't work please use very small tacks so as not to crack the wood. Kindly share the results with me. Peter. Here's the process:

1) Rough cut from log section on bandsaw:		2) Set on lathe for turning 'between centers'	
3) Cup shape cut from one end. Wood held in 'chuck' to all cutting of end as cup shape.		4) Replaced on Lathe - rough shaped as handle. 'Between Centers'	
5) Shaped and wax applied 'between centers'		6) Holding to 'feel shape'- several tests were made to get the right feel - though proof will be in the using
