The Events of 1913 -1914

- 1) RR&G Service to Ashmore ends, and the tramway is apparently removed.
- 2) Cady Lumber Company begins milling operations at McNary.
- 3) Louisiana Sawmill Co. begins milling operations at Bolton (SE of Glenmora)
- 4) Alexandria Lumber Company (50% Crowell owned) begins logging operations southwest of Glenmora.
- 5) Crowell & Spencer build the machine shop at Long Leaf, and the RR&G now operates out of Long Leaf to Lecompte.
- 7) Meridian Lumber Co. begins logging and milling operations at Meridian Crowell & Spencer extend an existing tramway to Cocodrie to connect with the Meridian tram to Meridian. RR&G is given trackage rights to Meridian from Long Leaf.

January, 1914

The RR&G "purchases" the line from Louisiana Junction to Bolton, to serve the Louisiana Sawmill Co.
