This report is based upon a brief visit to the tract of 28,000 acres included in the special contract with the Louisiana Conservation Commission. The writer spent two days, December 9 and 10, 1913, on the tract in company with Mr. Henry E. Hardtner, President of the Company, and Mr. W. H. Thompson, a warden of the State Conservation Commission.

The Tract

General

The tract, which is a portion of the Company's holdings of about 80,000 acres, possesses favorable features for administration under the contract and for undertaking investigations in natural reforestation and growth. Urania lies in the northern central portion of the State and this part of the company's lands has come to be known in the State as:
