

neighborhood of \$300 to each party. Remeasurements every five years should be sufficient, and the intermediate cost for protection and repairs should be slight.

The most favorable time of year for this work is between November 1 and April 1. The fall months are the driest usually, but early spring would be a favorable time.

Notes on 1913 Seed Crop of Longleaf Pine

Practically every longleaf tree of seed-bearing age yielded a full crop of seed in 1913. The excellent quality of the seed is shown by the large numbers of seedlings which germinated in November and early December. This quick germination was fostered by an unusually warm fall accompanied by frequent though light rainfall. As usual, hogs destroyed much of the seed which collected in small heaps in ruts or open depressions. (Continued next page)
