Dear Miss Dorman,-

President Hardtner has requested me to notify you of your appointment on the Legislative Committee of the Louisiana Forestry Association. This committee, he announces, will be asked to meet at Urania at some date in April "to map out a plan of work and submit such recommendations to the legislature".

Enclosed is a copy of the present forestry laws of this state, which are the fruit of much careful thought in the past, and which are on the whole an excellent set of laws. Changing conditions have, however, made desirable a number of corresponding changes in these laws, and I have taken the liberty of indicating in blue pencil some of the passages which will be most in need of revision. These are merely suggestions, however, and we sincerely trust that you will give some thought not only to them but to any other proposals which may appear of importance to you.

The date of the committee meeting will be sent you later. In the meantime, President Hardtner, who is ex-officio member of the committee, would welcome suggestions as to lines of action.
