Thank you for bearing with me as I put materials together for the many interested parties that have expressed interest in this project. Besides you (the scholars) I have been preparing information for AAA, AARP, the Louisiana Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism, the D-Day Museum, the Louisiana Division of the Arts and potential funding sources. Yes, this is a huge project and has been a daunting one for me as I've only been at the LEH 8 months. But it is a most exciting project and one I am proud to be a part of. I hope you feel the same as you peruse the materials I have prepared for you.

At this time, I have been visiting the 6 host sites, learning about what was going on in their communities during WWII, as well as filling them in with greater details on the project. The stories about WWII are unbelievable and amazing. Their enthusiasm to tell these stories is even greater. Local involvement and participation grows by the day as schools, government officials, chambers of commerce and businesses are made aware of the upcoming event.

But they are desperate for scholars to participate in the project in numerous ways. As you will notice, the LEH is providing up to \$5000 in grants for each site, so honorariums will be available. The sites are also raising additional funds on their own through local banks, chambers of commerce, businesses, tourism organizations, Wal-Mart and the decentralized arts councils.
