## About the National Association of Civilian Conservation Corps Alumni (NACCCA)

The NACCCA was established as a non-profit organization in 1977 in the State of California. The NACCCA has over 140 Chapters with members in most states across the nation. The National Headquarters, CCC Museum and Research Center is located at 16 Hancock Avenue in Jefferson Barracks in St. Louis, Missouri.

The NACCCA offers annual national reunions and awards a \$1000 scholarship each year to a deserving student. This organization also continues to work to influence others and promote the conservation and work ethics of the CCC. The NACCCA has already influenced federal, state, city, and county authorities across America where CCC-type programs have been developed to help the youth of today work and develop important skills. We continue this important task so millions of young people benefit as former CCC'ers did in the past.

The NACCCA is a private not-for-profit organization that is funded by membership dues and donations. The organization is guided by a board of directors and employs a staff of two full time and one part time positions.

## The Membership
