Chronology and newspaper accounts from the Tramway 1895-1906

Mr. James Calhoon met with a very painful accident last Monday. He was going home from Glenmora, and while crossing Crowell & Spencer's tram road he fell out of his wagon. His head struck one of the steel rails, and the wagon wheel ran over his head, bruising same very much, and cutting several very large gashes. Dr. Phillips was summoned and dressed the wounds. He was doing very well when last heard from. The owners of this tram should fix the crossings where they cross public roads.

July 25, 1895 From the Alexandria Town Talk On motion of Mr. Randolph:

Resolved, That Crowell & Spencer, owners and builders of the tramway near Glenmora, be and they are hereby notified to put the public road in good condition for travel where their tramway crosses it, and remove all trash and obstructions they have put in said public road immediately, and the syndic on said road is hereby instructed to enforce the law in regard to obstructing public roads, if this ordinance is not immediately complied with.

August 22, 1895 From the Alexandria Town Talk

Apparently the tram was not in business for very long before the parish government got involved stimulated by the local press.
