of re-seeding without having to make allowances for all manner of stock grazing, they have had parts of the tract fenced, and twice a year will re-examine the plots to note what seedlings have come in, and how the various seedlings already present have fared. The study will not be finished for probably 10 years, and possibly longer. The next good seed year for pine will be awaited eagerly by the foresters at Urania.
