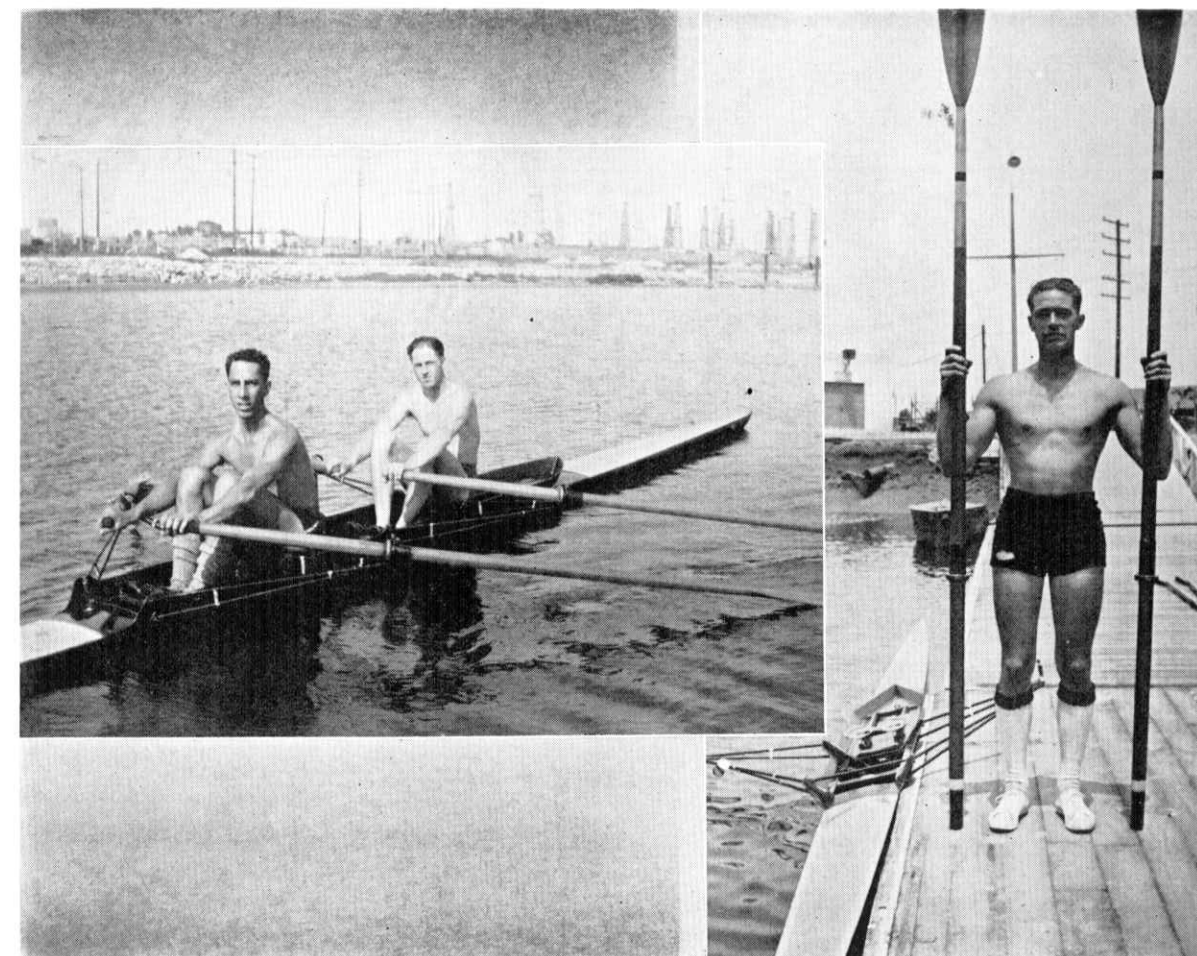

SOUTH END ROWING CLUB

In San Francisco, or anywhere, those four words stand for the best in rowing, swimming, hand ball and good fellowship. Sixty-one years of achievement behind them—"South End Rowing Club was formed in 1874 after four unknowns defeated a previously unbeaten San Francisco Crew. The followers of this group formed the S. E. R. C. to finance a new boat for the victors." Time was, when S. E. R. C., like Alameda, swept the boards, winning all five championship events, as in 1917 and 1918.

A grand line of scullers and crew men have

come from this peppery Club—for instance, today they present a Senior Crew, three of the four members of which rowed on the "Cal" Olympic Champ "8" in '32, who went on to take the National Four-Oared Championship at Chicago in 1933 and Coast Championship in 1934—Bobbie Cumming from '28 to '33 the Coast Lightweight Champion Sculler (unseated last year by San Diego's Woodie Wilson) and Bob Jensen the 1934 winner of both the Junior and Senior Sculling Championship titles.

ARIEL ROWING CLUB

The Ariel Rowing Club of San Francisco was organized in 1870, the oldest of the boat clubs on the coast. Eugene Flanders has served as Secretary for over sixty years. Because of the progress and development of the San Francisco Harbor during this long period, the Club has been compelled to erect, at different times, several new houses.

The Club has held many championships in past years. Henry C. Peterson carried the A. R. C. colors in races in England, Australia and completely over the United States and Canada. They were also carried in many races by the only family of four racing brothers of real championship caliber (Charles, Henry, Jim and Edward Wilson) rowing in singles, doubles and four-oared crews.

Present Club officers are: President, E. S. Sullivan; vice-president, J. C. Wolk; secretary, Eugene Flanders; treasurer, E. D. Sullivan; captain, J. McCormick; board of directors, Senator James A. Wilson, Ed Starke, Pete Beasley, Wm. De Mattei, Charles Andrus.

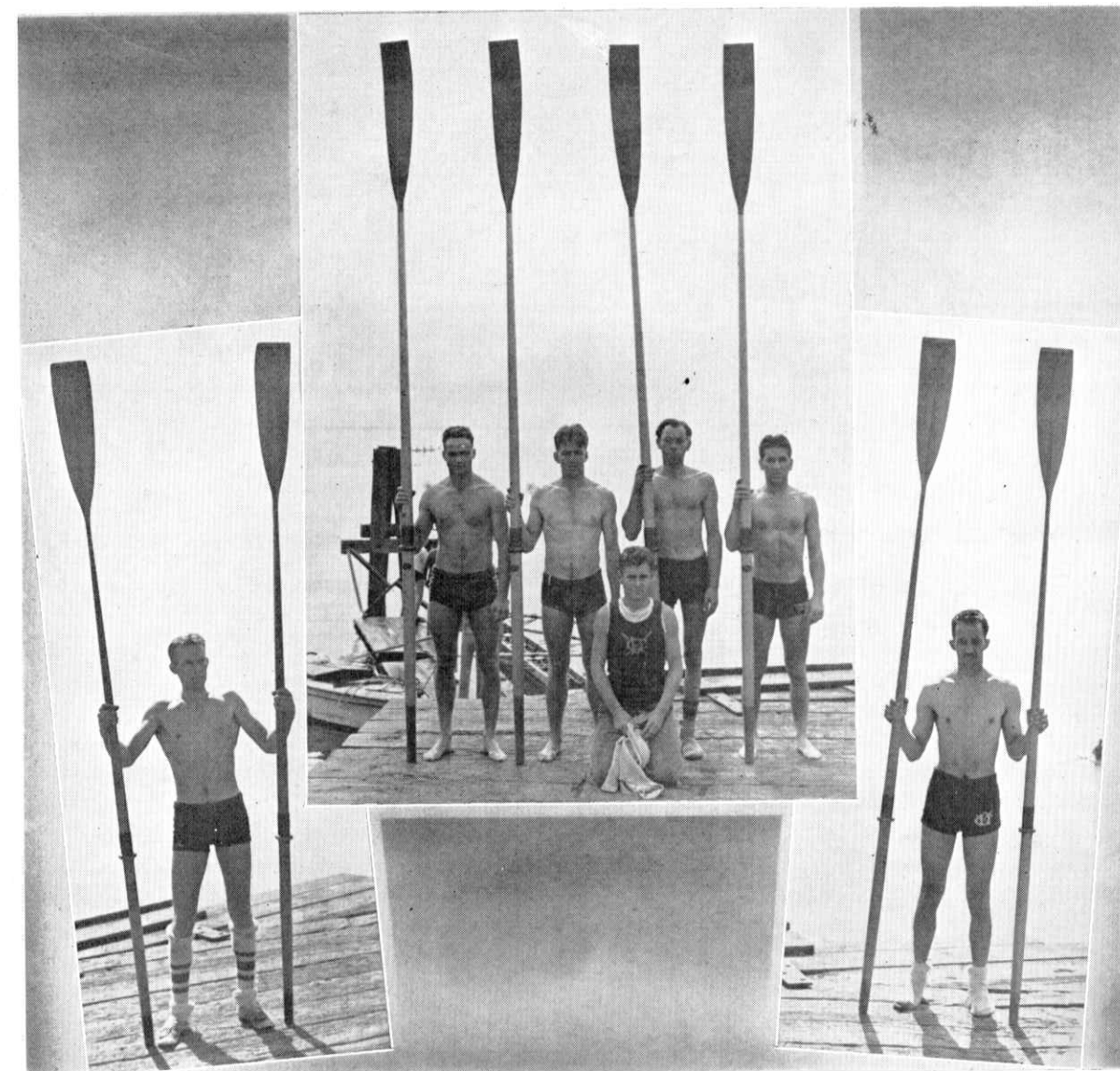
