

Reynolds by winning this race, made it three in a row, equaling Buster Olds' record. Olds, who won in 1931, 32 and 33 was piloted by Harry Rapp, the cagey Gate pilot, who used to show the way for Rex Mason. Syd Foster is credited with having won three Dolphin swims but they were not three in a row. Olds' time of 21:47 for the 1932 swim still stands as the record.

There were 19 starters, 17 finished. Bill Mahood, Oakland police officer, was last man.
