

# **TOMORROW Dolphins Honor 11 Members**

Big names in the colorful history of San Francisco make up the roster of 11 men who will be signally honored tomorrow night at Tom DiMaggio's North Beach eatery by members of the Dolphin Swimming and Boating Club.

Businessmen, fraternal leaders, sports celebrities and professional leaders are listed as honored guests on this occasion which will mark at least their 40 years' uninterrupted membership in this athletic club. Among them are:

Hugh McKevitt, attorney and leader in Shrine circles, one of the great athletes of yesteryear. Hugh joined the Dolphin Club in 1903. The vigorous physique that is characteristic of this leader of men can, in a measure, be attributed to the many miles he rowed and swam in San Francisco bay.

Who among the oldsters in San Francisco athletic history will ever forget the prowess of Al Hagedorn, the huge, muscled caveman type who could look tough enough to scare the average person, but who was as gentle as a lamb. Al was a great competitor and is a former president of the Dolphin Club.

Joe Keenan, of the firm of Musto-Keenan Company, the pioneer North Beach firm. A member of the Dolphin Club for 55 years. Though Joseph B. never became an outstanding athletic champion, he was always active in the affairs of the club and one of its most loyal members.

Tom Harris joined the Dolphins in 1902 and made athletic history in just about every sport. Tom is another former president.

Heading the list, Jimmy Cronin, who, though he denies being the first white child born in California, admits that he was not in swaddling clothes when he joined the Dolphins in 1891. Jimmy has held about every office in this club. He has for the past 20 years, or more, been treasurer, and no guardian of the exchequer ever took his task more seriously than does this perennial athlete, who still hikes about seven miles a day and takes his daily dip in the bay.

Commander George W. Bauer, USN, member 44 years; Dr. A. W. Ward, member 43 years; Patrick Flynn, member 41 years; Dr. D. L. Peronne, member 43 years; Dr. E. M. McKevitt, member 40 years, and Dave Crowley, member 40 years.
