1835.

Sir

At the request of Mr. Absolom Shade I
send you the description contained in the
Deed from B. Malloy to Mr. Andrew Nelles
which is as follows

“ That certain tract or parcel of land being part
“ of the aforesaid tract (meaning the Indian
“ territory generally) butted and bounded as
“ follows that is commencing at a certain Marsh
“ South of the Road leading from the Township
“ of Burford to the Grand River at a Stake to be
“ planted where a line to be run from a Post
“ standing North $78 \frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ and 30 “ East 114 chains
“ from Wheeler Douglas land from the North
“ East angle of said land [be?] the said Wheeler

“ Douglas obtained from the said Six Nations
“ through their agent the late Captain Joseph
“ Brant from said Post to run South 15° 30 “
“ West so far from the place of beginning as to
“ contain Six hundred acres between the aforesaid
“ line and the Township of Burford by bounding
“ on the Marsh Southward by the whole length of
“ the aforesaid Six hundred acres thence South
“ 78 1/2° 30 “ West to the town line of Burford
“ thence following the said Town line of
“ Burford Southwardly till it intersects the
“ aforesaid Marsh thence following the windings
“ and turning of the said Marsh an Eastwardly
“ course to the place of beginning to contain
“ six hundred acres by bounding the whole of
“ one side of said land upon the said Marsh;.”
