

**(OBVERSE)**

[The following writing in faint black ink is found exactly to the right of red sealing wax mark at the top centre of the page, which reads:

“10 (Doller?)  
(For?) the (underlined) Sir”]

[The following writing in faint black ink is found exactly under the red sealing wax mark, which reads:

“John S. Baldwin  
25<sup>th</sup> July  
1838”]  
Jules (Luesnel?) Esq.  
Montreal

[A black circular postmark is seen above the black ink writing “Jules”, which reads:

“CITY OF TORONTO U.C (wraps around)  
JY 25  
1838”]

[A “PAID” black stamp is seen on right beside the “1838” writing in ink]

[A giant “2/4” written in faint red ink is seen right beside the “PAID” black stamp mark]

**(REVERSE)**
