[On the top left corner of the page, a circular red stamp mark reads:

**(REVERSE)**

ON THIS DAY, the (Twenty?) Eighth of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five at the request of holders of the original Bill, whereof a true copy is on the other side written: I, the undersigned, PUBLIC NOTARY, duly commissioned by Royal Authority, in and for the province of Upper Canada, residing in the Village of Dundas went to the Office of the (Bauth?) of Upper Canada in (commission?) where the said Bill is made payable and speaking unto Andrew (Lteview?) Esquire the (cashier?) exhibited unto (here?) the said original Bill, and demanded payment thereof, whereunto he answered “(I?) have (offer?) to pay if “.....”

THEREFORE, I the said Notary, at the request aforesaid, have Protested, and by these presents do solemnly protest as well against the Drawers and Endorsers of the said original Bill, as against all others whom it may concern, for all costs, charges, damages and interests suffered and to be suffered, for want of payment of the said Bill.

Done and Protested, at Hamilton, aforesaid, the day and year above written.
