My Dear Archy

I take the opportunity of Mr. Laurier writing to you to take the half of his sheet to say a few words. I will begin with myself; I have always been confined to the house since you left this but am now getting better, an able to go about a little; I expect to be able to start with Mr. Roy shortly to Niagara or Queenston to set a railway agoing.

You did not mention in yours' anything concerning the news you had in your letters from home: I have never got a word yet, and am wearying dreadfully to hear from there; i think you mentioned that your Aunt had said to you that Mr. Freeland had also brought a letter to me; it has never come to hand; I would have written to Brockville for it, but did like to do so [?] I heard from you to see whether that [ripped from wax seal] the case: if Mr. F really brought a letter to me, I think it [ripped] somewhat unaccountable that he has not forwarded it; do write me soon and let me know how the matter stands; and at any rate give me all the news.

You will no doubt be surprised at Mr. Pollcks' behaviour but from what JOhn Fairgreene says of him he must not be the clean potatoe: I think that you ought at any rate to let him know that you are acquainted with his proceedings.

Our friend Bell has again left the situation he was in when you were here, he called here one day but I have not seen him since, they were both in town for some time but I never say Mrs. B - I was informed that she was before the Mayor
