[1 red circular postmark can be seen on the left side of the middle of the page, which reads:

‘KINGSTON

NOV

(Unclear character, possibly ‘&’)

UP-CAN’]

[An ‘1833’ can be seen just on the right of the postmark]

[Just around the postmark, a few lines can be seen as indicated below:

‘Nov. L.N.D (two unknown characters, possibly sender’s name, as the whole name is underlined)

Saviour (unknown word)

York’]

[Above these few lines, a single letter (I?) can be seen]

[Below these lines, a few other lines are written on the letter in an upside-down manner:

‘James Sampson – (unknown word, possibly name of a particular city/location?)

(Mistern?) (Broken part of letter) 9 Nov. 1822.

(Sometime?) (Broken part of letter) & Deposit

(Sign of British pound?) 49.10 (unknown character, possibly a ‘G’?)
