In your District, if he shall be found
therein, and him safely keep, so as that you may have his body
before our Judge of our Court, at the Court House in Hamilton, on the
Ffirst ----- day of March -----term next, being the twenty
fifth -----day of March now next ensuing,
to answer to Ira Woolson ----- in a plea of trespass on the case upon promise
And have you then and there this Writ.

Witness THOMAS TAYLOR, Esquire, Judge of the said District Court at Hamilton, this
twenty ninth day of December --- in the year of our Lord one thousand eight
hundred and thirty two and the third year of our Reign.
