Three months after date, I promise to pay  
to R [Mo?] [unknown surname] or order, at the Office of the  
BANK OF UPPER CANADA, at Port Hope, the sum of  
Seventy Pounds by  
currency, value received.

Hope, (the lines hereafter are written in an italicized font) being the place where the same is  
made payable, and speaking to him, did de-  
mand payment of the said Note to which demand he answered

wherefore I, the said Notary, at the request aforesaid, have protested and do hereby sol-  
emnly protest, as well against all parties to the said Note as against all others whom  
it may concern, for all (the lines hereafter are not italicized) Interest, Damages, Costs, Charges,  
Expenses and other losses suffered, or to be suffered for want of payment of the said note.  
(lines hereafter are italicized again) And afterwards, on the  
day and year mentioned in the margin, I, the said (lines hereafter are not italicized) Notary  
Public, did sewe due no-  
tice according to law, of the presentment, non-payment and protest of the said Note, upon the  
several parties thereto, (the lines hereafter are italicized until the end) by depositing in Her  
Majesty’s Post Office at Port Hope,  
being the nearest post office to the place of the said presentment, letters containing such  
notices, one of which letters was addressed to each of the said parties severally, the super-  
scription and address of which letters are respectively copied below, as follows, that is to say:

W. S. Marsh Esq    Hope

R. M [unknown surname] Esq    Port Hope

John (Baker?) Esq      Port Hope
