In a Plea of Trespass on the case upon promises. **FOR THAT WHEREAS**, the said Defendant on the first day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty at Hamilton in the said District, was indebted to the said Plaintiff in the sum of Ten Pounds of lawful money of Upper Canada, for the work and labor, cadre3 and diligence, of the said Plaintiff by him the said Plaintiff before that time done, performed, and bestowed, in and about the business of the said Defendant and for the said Defendant and at his special instance and request; and also, in the further sum of. Ten Pounds of like lawful money, for divers goods waves, and merchandize, by the said Plaintiff before that time sold and delivered to the said Defendant and at like request; and also, in the further sum of Ten Pounds of the like lawful money, for money by the said Plaintiff before that time lent and advanced to, and paid, and laid out and expended for the said Defendant and at his like request; and also, in the further sum of Ten Pounds of like lawful money, for other money by the said Defendant before that time had and received, to and for the use of the said Plaintiff; and also, in the further sum of Ten Pounds of like lawful money, for meat, drink, washing, lodging, and other necessities, by the said Plaintiff before that time found and provided of the said Defendant and at his like request; and also, in the further sum of Ten Pounds of like lawful money, on an account on the day and year last aforesaid, orated and settled between he said Plaintiff and the said Defendant; and being so indebted he the said Defendant then and there undertook and promised the said Plaintiff to pay him the said several sums of money in this Count mentioned, when he should be thereto afterwards requested. Yet the said Defendant although often requested so to do, hath hitherto wholly neglected and refused, and still doth neglect and refuse to pay the said several sums of money alone mentioned, or any part thereof, to the said Plaintiff as he say to his damage of fifteen Pounds, and therefore he brings his suit, to
