Few black inks stain on the right side of the paragraph.

(In reverse order, same page)

Money letter (long space) [Rec?] Early Money letter Marking (in fade black ink and small cursive letters)

[unintelligible word] [unintelligible word] Mm (long space) [2 3] (crossed by a handwritten diagonal line, between the numbers, tilting to the right and three smaller handwritten diagonal lines tilting to the left). Small horizontal handwritten line in top of the space between the numbers.

A stamped arrow in black ink to the edge of the document next to the end of the number 2 3 (could be a post mark).

In the center low edge of the page there is a semicircle shape stain in red ink.

Two blank pages joined in the upper and lower middle by a transparent tape. The two pages are yellow by the passage of time and have few marks attribute to the passage of time. In the upper middle edge there is a stain in red in a semicircle shape (could be the back of the same stain described in the observe page).
