

LETTER FROM REES SHENEMAN TO WILLIAM DARLINGTON

Philadelphia January 18th 1841

Sir Coming from your place when I Came into
Broad St I stepped in the Weschester hous Mr. Nailors
and there I met with Mr haines he met me
very friendly I told him I Just Came from weschester
he asked me how kimes and me was Coming on
I told him I had not seen kimes – I had just ben
at weschester geting ready for the trial he Said
it would not Come on this Cort for Says he we haveent
tim to get a review I told him I wanted no
review he then apeared to get Cross after Some little
time I asked him if the were going to have a Review
if there would not be time yet before this Cort
he told me he did not know I told him if he did not
know did not know Naither did I Care –
it apeares to me as if the ware going to put the
trial off as far as the Can
I Request you not to have the trial put off if you
posebly Can for I want a stop put to Daming the
water on my primises
