

GRINNELL-NEWBURG SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS



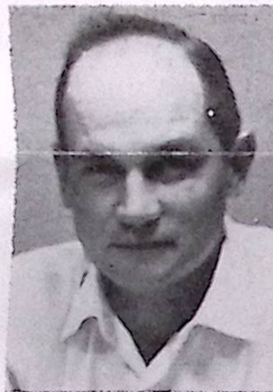
