FIREWORKS AT ARBOR LAKE.

So enjoyable and so popular have been the exhibitions of fireworks held at Arbor Lake on the last two Fourth of Julys that at a hastily called meeting of the Commercial Exchange in the City Hall Tuesday afternoon it was voted to continue the custom this year and to make it a bigger affair than ever.

It seemed to be the opinion of those present that this is the best kind of a celebration and the farmers and residents of Grinnell and vicinity will be heartily urged to join the members of the Exchange in thus fittingly observing the nation's great holiday.

It is planned to put more money into the fireworks this year than heretofore and a very creditable exhibition will be given from the shores of the lake. It is an ideal place for holding such a celebration and it is expected that the plan will meet with even greater favor with the people than heretofore though it would be hard to draw larger crowds than have been accomodated there on the last two occasions.

Chairman Coutts appointed F. M. Card, H. F. Lamphere and A. C. Rinefort a committee to raise the necessary funds which Grinnell's generous citizens will doubtless contribute most willingly.

Earl M. Neely was appointed chairman of a committee to look after the fireworks, the other members of the committee to be appointed by himself.

A committee was appointed, consisting of John Mehlin, Harry Belden and E. B. Work to see about closing the stores in town on the Fourth.
