

SUPERINTENDENT HENELY

ELECTED AND ACCEPTS

On Friday evening the school board met and unanimously elected Eugene Henely of Brooklyn superintendent of the Grinnell schools in place of D. A. Thornburg, resigned. Mr. Henely was in the city on Saturday and has accepted the position.

The new superintendent is a graduate of Ames in the class of 1890. For the past six years he has been superintendent at Brooklyn and previous to that time he held a similar position in the Oxford schools.
