

# SCHOOL OPENS

Grinnell's juvenile population will shortly be engaged in the momentous occupation of going to school. The advance echoes of the nine o'clock bell are already weighing on the atmosphere and several hundred boys and girls are awaking to the realization that those three pleasant months of summer have gone faster than they could realize.

There will be one more hilarious week made glorious by the great Grinnell fair, then the school year will begin. In other words, school opens next Monday, Sept. 11.

Superintendent Eugene Henely has been busily engaged for several weeks in setting all things in order. Buildings have been cleaned and repaired, the ranks of the teaching force have been filled and above all, 24 brand new benches for manual training, which is to begin this year in the Grinnell high school, have been installed in the old gymnasium room.

For teacher of manual training the school board is pleased that it has secured a competent man in the person of Louis Karns. Mr. Karns has prepared at Earlham College and at Chicago University and he has had one year of experience at Salem, Ind. He has proved his worth as a competent teacher and it is felt that a better man could not be secured to inaugurate this new department of the high school. Mr. Karns will also have charge of the high school football team. For two summers he has been one of the proteges of A. A. Stagg, the shrewd director of Chicago University athletics and last year he coached with credit the football team of the Salem high school.

G. W. Garrard succeeds G. T. Pendell as teacher of Physics in the high school, and will also have charge of the debating. He gained his experience along this latter line in Cornell College, Mt. Vernon, Iowa, where experience has shown Grinnell that they raise good defeaters, as well as an occasional fast football team. Last year Mr. Garrard taught in Marengo.

Miss Esther Egan succeeds Miss Long as English teacher in the high school, who has accepted a position in Great Falls, Mont. These are the only changes in the high school

faculty. Miss Helen Thomson continues as musical instructor and Miss Bessie Wallace to teach penmanship and drawing.
