Biographical/Historical

Stuart Math (1947-) is a documentary filmmaker who grew up in Shaker Heights, Ohio and now lives and works in New York City. He has produced and photographed films on a wide variety of subjects, from the history of the New York City subway (*River of Steel*) to the Lindy Hop (*Can't Top the Lindy Hop*); from race relations in the suburbs (*Shaker Heights: The Struggle for Integration*) to travelogues (*West Point: American Icon*). His work has been shown theatrically, broadcast nationally on PBS and cable TV, viewed in classrooms all over the country, and screened in film festivals worldwide.

Math's 1998 film *Shaker Heights: The Struggle for Integration* examines the Cleveland suburb's efforts to foster racial integration over four decades. The documentary highlights challenges such as the 1997 revelation of racial disparities in student test scores, prompting the community to reassess its commitment to equality.

Scope and Content

The Stuart Math Shaker Film archives measure 1.63 cubic feet and dates from 1966 to 1999 with the bulk of the collection dating from 1992-1999. The archives contain newspaper clippings, brochures, promotional materials, Ludlow Community Association reports, and city and school publications used in the research for the documentary.
