

Mrs. A. W. Crawford Seeks Divorce on Ground Mate Specializes in Alcohol.

A butterfly man powerfully concentrated in collecting the distilled dews of such loop flora as the high ball, pousse café, and cocktail is the description of Andrew Wright Crawford, supplied by Mrs. Evelyn Wright Crawford in her bill for divorce filed yesterday by Charles Erbsstein.

Mrs. Crawford says her husband has no occupation and finds his chief pleasure in drinking, to which he devotes much time and careful attention. She charges he is quarrelsome and cruel when in an intoxicated condition, and that these periods recur so frequently as to permit her no peace or opportunity to enjoy his companionship. Mrs. Crawford asks for custody of the children, Louise Evelyn, aged 9, and George Robert, aged 3.

On the basis of her allegation that there is to be a distribution of portions of the late Sarah L. Crawford estate among the heirs, of whom Andrew Wright Crawford is one, Attorney Erbsstein secured from Judge Thomson a temporary injunction restraining the Northern Trust company and William Burry, as trustees of the estate, from relinquishing Andrew Wright Crawford's share until after a disposition of the divorce suit.

Mrs. Crawford alleges that her husband's income is about \$5,000 a year, and she asks that the court make provision for the support of herself and two children.
