

SAUGATUCK-DOUGLAS MUSEUM

Just a short walk from the West Shore ferry landing is Saugatuck-Douglas's award-winning museum, operated by the Saugatuck-Douglas Historical Society.

The museum, housed in the historic Village Pump House (1904), features rotating local history exhibitions and permanent exhibits, plus a Museum Shop and Bookstore featuring Society publications on local history topics.

The museum, located on Park Street at Mount Baldhead Park, is open Noon to 4:00 p.m. daily June through August and weekends in September and October. The Museum gardens feature learning stations about area history and offer some of the best riverfront views in Saugatuck. ADMISSION ALWAYS FREE!

SAVING LIVES ON THE GREAT LAKES at the Douglas History Center & Garden

Visit the lifesaving and shipwreck boat-barn exhibit featuring the historic (1856) Francis *Gallinipper-1* life-boat and the famous steamship *Chicora* disaster. This is part of the Society's Back-In-Time garden pathway that tells stories from Saugatuck-Douglas history and geography. The Center and Garden is located at The Old School House, 131 Center Street, Douglas. Open daily Memorial Day to Labor Day. Free admission.
