






















Local Ground Rules

Out of Bounds — No. 1, 2 and 18, black top road line; No. 4, white stakes on right; No. 15, tree line; No. 16, white stakes. Penalty 1 stroke and distance.

Lost Ball — Penalty 1 stroke — Off tee, play provisional ball; Other, drop ball as near as possible to where ball was lost.


Ball in Creek — Ball may be lifted and dropped not nearer hole, penalty 1 stroke.

Ball in roads or foot paths may be dropped back — not nearer hole — no penalty.

Ball Behind Screen on No. 2 — Place ball 2 club lengths out.

Ball on Ramp to No. 7 Tee — Place behind No. 6 green, penalty, 1 stroke.



















Patti Shook-Boice

*The Valparaiso graduate won the national collegiate championship and also was a seven-time women's state champ.


*The daughter of former Saginaw County Club pro Loren Shook won 11 Spring Lake championships in her career.

Course Rules

The Rules of the U.S.G.A. will govern all play unless modified by local rules.

Attention:—The following rules must be observed by members and visitors alike.

- (1) Fivesomes not allowed on course.
- (2) Out of Bounds: White Stake on No. 1, 4, 5, 9, 10, 13, 14, 18.
- (3) Ball in water or ditch-

Drop out not nearer hole, penalty, one stroke, keeping hazard between player and hole.

Slow players must let faster players through.




THE CLUBHOUSE AS SEEN FROM THE PRACTICE GREEN

CHARLES FEELEY PRO-OWNER Clearbrook Country Club

Long associated with the game of golf is the hostprofessional and Clearbrook country club owner Charles Feeley. Like many other professionals, he began as a caddy at Knickerbocker Country Club in Tenafly, New Jersey.

Following four years service in the Air Force he began his PGA assistantship at Gull Lake country club in Kalamazoo.




Twin Orchard Country Club in Lake Zurich, Illinois was his next move, then on as Resident and teaching pro at Canyon Country Club in Palm Springs, California. It was during his five years at Canyon that he became well known as the youngest teaching professional with a national following.

With Palm Springs' reputation as the famous "golf capitol of the world" his pupils have included many greats from the worlds of stage and screen, politics and professional sports. The long list would include Gene Barry, Frank Sinatra, William Demarest, David Janssen, Jack and Mary Benny, Don Adams, Chuck Connors, Kamela Connors, Keeley Smith, Jackie Cooper,


Robert Stack, Hugh O'Brien and Glen Campbell. Others are Pierre Salinger, Dean Rusk, Hank Aguirre, Peanuts Lowry, Billy Gambrell, Jack Sanford, Ron Perronoski, Don Drysdale, Sandy Koufax, Roman Gabriel, George Low, former CIA head Admiral Rayburn and former Los Angeles Police chief Tom Reddin.

Sensing that the Saugatuck area with its setting of natural beauty was an outstanding location for golf course activity, he purchased the course and club house in August 1967 and began immediately the expansion program of the course with a new patio, practice range, front nine modifications and improvements, enlarged pro shop and new snack bar.



WHERE IT ALL BEGINS Here in this huge twin tee, golfers begin both the front and back nines.









George B. Ferry Obituary Commercial Record January 26, 1960


SAUGATUCK (Special) - George B. Ferry, 82, of Saugatuck died early this morning in Douglas Hospital following a five week Illness. He had lived in Saugatuck vicinity for the past 48 years. Mr. Ferry was a golf architect, having owned the Saugatuck Golf Course. For the past eight years he was sexton of Riverside Cemetery in Saugatuck.
