Shopping for ice cream – a way of life?

ICE CREAM! In the summer of 2010 there were 15 establishments serving ice cream in the villages and Saugatuck Township carrying on a tradition which began in the 1880s when the first ice cream factory opened in Saugatuck. When the drug store built a new building in 1913, a long soda fountain was installed, where it was rumored the chocolate soda was invented. Shop keepers who dip the frozen dessert say that this area is one of

the few places they have ever been where customers actually shop for their ice cream cones, going down the street noting flavors available, prices, types of cones, and the length of the lines waiting, before deciding what and where to buy.


