

he Red Dog Bed & Breakfast was built in 1879 for Jake Metzger who brought his barbering skills from Germany to the lumbermen of early Saugatuck. Metzger had the small building that housed his barbershop moved from Butler Street and attached it to his new home. For 99 years, three generations of his family lived and worked on Mason Street.

Over the years, the house was remodeled and transformed from private residence to boarding house and eventually into one of the first bed & breakfasts in Saugatuck.

In the 1960's, Jake Metzger's grandson converted the old barbershop into an ice cream shop, which it

remains today.

oday, **The Red Dog Bed & Breakfast** carries on the Saugatuck tradition of hospitality. There are six comfortable air conditioned rooms to choose from, four with private bath.

The large living room with fireplace is just the spot to warm up after a winter afternoon of cross country

skiing.
