## A Birthday Celebration for Susan B. Anthony Sponsored by The Park House

Susan B. Anthony was born on February 15, 1820 in Adams, Mass. Reared in western New York by Quaker parents, she developed her sense of independence at an early age. An ardent abolitionist, she was also one of the founders of the Woman's State Temperance Society of New York. Miss Anthony was an early campaigner for the right of woman to control their own property, for the right to guardianship of their children and the right to vote. From 1892-1900 she served as President of the National American Woman Sufferage Association. She died on March 13, 1906. Fourteen years after her death, the 19th Amendment providing for full female suffrage was passed..

Susan B. Anthony was a guest at The Park House during the 1870's. In honor of her birthday and her connection with Saugatuck, The Pettys have invited Candace Anderson of Kalamazoo to present a program celebrating the birthday of Susan B. Anthony and the 70th anniversary of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution. Miss Anderson gives her performances of Woman in History with guitar and singing. She has won an award from the American Women in Radio and Television for Best Radio Documentary entitled "The Perfect 36." This refers to the 36 States that were required to ratify the 19th Amendment.

The Susan B. Anthony Birthday Party will be an annual event sponsored by The Park House. Anyone who is interested may volunteer by contacting Lynda Petty.
