Course of Study in the Female Seminary.

PREPARATORY.

Reading, Orthography, Penmanship, Geography, Arithmetic begun, English Grammar, History of United States (Willard).

PRIMARY CLASS.

First Session.—Arithmetic finished, English Grammar, Universal History, Natural Philosophy (Parker).

SECOND SESSION.—Ancient and Modern Geography and History, English Grammar finished, Physiology (Cutter), Botany (Lincoln).

JUNIOR CLASS.

First Session.—Algebra (Davies), Geometry begun, Rhetoric (Blair), Chemistry (Youman) SECOND SESSION.—Geometry continued, Plane Trigonometry, Mensuration, Geography of Heavenly Bodies (Burnett).

SENIOR CLASS.

First Session.—Political Science (Wayland), Elements of Criticism (Kames), Moral Science (Wayland), Roman and Grecian Antiquities (Salkeld).

SECOND SESSION.—Mental Philosophy (Upham), Logic (Whately), Evidences of Christianity (Alexander), Natural Theology (Paley).

Scripture, History, and Composition are studied through

the entire course.

Those desiring it, receive instruction in the Greek, Latin, and French languages.

Kules of the Institution.

1st. Students shall enter any of the regular classes on giving evidence of a thorough acquaintance with the preceding branches of the course, or with such other studies as shall, by the Faculty, be deemed an equivalent.

2d. Every student shall apply himself to such studies as may be selected by his guardian, or prescribed by his

teachers.

3d. No student shall absent himself from recitation without permission from his teacher.

4th. At the close of each session students are examined in the studies of that session.

5th. On the day of commencement, candidates for degrees shall perform such exercises as shall be assigned by the Faculty.

6th. Every student shall attend public worship on the Sabbath, and maintain a proper deportment.

7th. Students are required to exhibit, to all with whom they associate, a courteous and respectful deportment.

8th. Students are not allowed to frequent taverns, balls, saloons, or gaming tables, or to use as a beverage intoxicating drinks, under penalty of the severest discipline of the Institution.

9th. For every offence or neglect of duty the student may be called to account by the Faculty, who may reprove, suspend or expel, as the case may require.

10th. No expulsion shall be final, until approved by the

Board of Trustees.

General Remarks.

1st. Waynesburg College is situated at Waynesburg, the capital of Greene County, Pa. The location of the institution possesses unusual advantages in regard to health, and compares favorably with other villages in morality and intelligence. It has a population of about 1,500. There are in it six churches.

2d. The College building is a three-story brick edifice, containing a Chapel, Society Halls, Rooms for Recitations,

Libraries, Apparatus, &c.

3d. The Course of Studies in the Institution is designed to embrace the latest improvements; the Text Books are prepared by the most accomplished scholars, and the method of instruction is calculated to impart thorough knowledge of the branches studied.

Students in Philosophy and Chemistry have the advantage of an extensive apparatus, selected in view of illus-

trations and public lectures.

4th. Parents and guardians are assured that strict attention will be given to the moral as well as to the intellectual culture of the ladies and gentlemen who may attend the Institution. The government is designed to be parental, and will be mildly, but strictly enforced, securing attention to study by cultivating in the youthful mind a taste for intellectual pursuits and virtuous habits.

5th. Boarding can be had in private families at moderate rates.

Those desiring it can board themselves at an expense not exceeding seventy-five cents per week. This statement is based upon actual experiment, and the plan is recommended to students expecting to attend the Institution.

The Academic Year embraces two sessions. The first session commences on the first Monday in November, the second on the first Monday in May. Vacation months, October and April.
