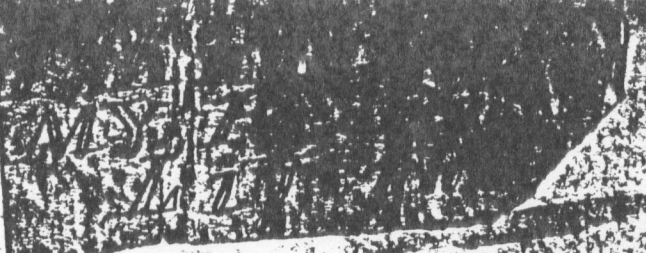


In this Borough on the 10th inst. died

DEATH OF WM. MCCLELLAND,
Esq. — William McClelland, Esq., of
this place, died on Sabbath evening
last, aged about 80 years. The de-
ceased was son of the late Hon. Asa
McClelland of this place, and has
spent his whole life in Waynesburg
and its immediate vicinity. For
many years he was an active and en-
terprising citizen of our town, but
some eight or ten years ago he was
suddenly stricken with total blind-
ness, from which he never recovered.
From this time forth he became the
helpless charge of his devoted wife,
who waited on him with all the con-
stant and tender care that could be
given to a helpless babe. Some
years since she had the great joy of
having him make a public profession
of religion, when he joined the C.
P. Church, and was ever after a con-
sistent and exemplary member. He
had long been a member of the Ma-
sonic Order, and his remains were
interred in Green Mount Cemetery
with the honors of the fraternity, on
Monday evening, the 8th instant, fol-
lowed to the tomb by a large con-

James G. Garrettson, 65, of Waynesburg, R. D. 4, died at 8:15 a. m., Friday, Jan. 13, 1950, in the Greene County Memorial Hospital. He had been seriously ill three weeks.

Mr. Garrettson, a son of William and Frances John Garrettson, was born Dec. 23, 1884, in Waynesburg. For 20 years he was employed as a machinist by the Waynesburg & Washington Railroad, and later worked for 16 years as a machinist at the Manufacturers Light & Heat Co. pump station on the Rogersville road west of Waynesburg. He retired Dec. 31, 1949.

On April 8, 1908, he married Daisy Boyd, who survives. Surviving, besides his wife, are one son, James Garrettson, Jr., of Sycamore, R. D. 2; one grandson, James Garrettson III; one sister, Mrs. Georgina Tharp, of Waynesburg, R. D. 4, and three brothers, H. C. Garrettson, of Washington; Walter M. Garrettson, of Waynesburg, and A. J. Garrettson, of Waynesburg, R. D. 4.

WALTER M. GARRETTSON

Walter M. (Mac) Garrettson, 81, of Clarksville, formerly of Waynesburg and Brock, died at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, October 3, 1970, in St. Thomas Hospital, Akron, Ohio. He had been visiting a daughter at Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, when he became ill.

A son of William and Frances Johnson Garrettson, he was born November 12, 1889 in Waynesburg, and resided virtually all his life at Brock and Waynesburg. For the last few months he had been making his home with his daughter, Mrs. Clifford Nyswaner, at Clarksville.

Mr. Garrettson was a retired employe of the West Penn Power Company and in early life had been employed by the Pennsylvania Railroad. He served with the Army in World War I.

Mr. Garrettson was a member of the First Baptist Church of Waynesburg; James Farrell Post 330, American Legion, and Waynesburg Lodge 469, I. O. O. F. He was a lifetime member of the Brotherhood of Trainmen.

His first wife, Mabel Tharp Garrettson, died February 5, 1961. His second wife, Delphia Tennant Garrettson, died June 30, 1969.

Surviving are two daughters by his first marriage, Mary, wife of Clifford Nyswaner, of Clarksville, and Virgie, wife of Raymond G. Cummings Jr., of Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio; six grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

One sister and three brothers are deceased.

Mrs. Elizabeth McClelland died at her home on West Main street, this place, on Saturday morning last, December 6th, 1890. As our readers are aware, Mrs. McClelland met with an accident a little more than a week since; by her clothes catching fire at an open grate, and though it was hoped and believed at the time that her injuries were not necessarily fatal, the shock to the nervous system of the aged lady was so great that death followed at the time stated. Mrs. McClelland was born in this place October 10, 1806, and was, consequently, 84 years of age on the 10th of October last. She was the second child of the late Hon. Andrew and Rhoda Buchanan, and as mentioned a week since, the elder sister of J. A. J. Buchanan, Esq., and Col. John Buchanan of Waynesburg, and David Buchanan, Esq., of Morris tp. She was married to the late Wm. McClelland, Esq., in 1824, and had spent her entire life in Waynesburg and vicinity. She was among the oldest members of the C. P. Church, and was perhaps the oldest resident of the town at the time of her death. Two daughters, Mrs. Rhoda Strosnider of this place, and Mrs. Jacob Lemley, of the west, survive her. Mrs. McClelland was rather a remarkable woman for one of her years, being smart, quick and active, and retaining a mental vigor unusual in the octogenarian. She was widely known and had many friends, who almost universally spoke of her as "Aunt Betsey McClelland." The funeral services were held in the C. P. Church on Sabbath afternoon at 2 o'clock, where the body was taken, and a very appropriate and fitting sermon was preached by the pastor. Rev. J. P. Sprowls, assisted by Rev. J. A. Donahey of the Presbyterian Church, and Rev. A. B. Miller, her former pastor. The remains were then viewed by the large congregation assembled, after which the concourse of relatives, friends and acquaintances followed the body to its last resting place in Green Mount Cemetery.

OBITUARY

MCCLELLAND.

Mrs. Elizabeth McClelland, who was severely burned last week, died from the effects of the burns on Saturday morning December 6, 1890. Mrs. McClelland was a daughter of Hon. Andrew Buchanan, and a sister to Col. John, and J. A. J. Buchanan Esqr., of this place, and of Mr. David Buchanan of Sycamore. She was born in Waynesburg Oct. 10, 1806, being 84 on the 10th of October last. She was the widow of William McClelland. Mrs. Jacob Lenley, now in the west, and Mrs. Rhoda Strossider of this place, are daughters of the deceased. She was a member of the C. P. church, and was a woman of christian character. She was still active, insisting on sweeping and doing other work about the house up until the time of the sad accident which deprived her of her life. On Sunday last, at 2 p. m. Funeral services were conducted at the C. P. church by Rev. J. P. Sprowls, assisted by Rev. J. A. Donahay and Rev. A. B. Miller. The body was then viewed for the last time by a large number of friends, after which it was interred in Green Mount Cemetery.

"Aunt Betsey" McClelland, an aged and well-known lady residing on West Main street, this place, had a very narrow escape from a horrible death on Monday morning last. She was standing in front of an open grate, when her clothes took fire, burning her wearing apparel almost entirely from her body and burning the lower half of her person very severely, before help hastily summoned, succeeded in smothering out the flames. Her injuries while quite severe for one of her years to bear, we are glad to say are not necessarily dangerous, and her friends hope to soon see her well again. Mrs. McClelland is the elder sister of Col. John and J. A. J. Buchanan, Esq., of this place; and David Buchanan, Esq., of Morris township.

A. J. Garrettson, 61, of Waynesburg, R. D. 4, died at 5:40 p. m., Tuesday, October 14, 1952, in the Greene County Memorial Hospital. He had been ill for six months. He was admitted to the hospital seven weeks ago and had been on the critical list for the last two weeks.

Mr. Garrettson was born October 18, 1890, at Blacksville, W. Va. He was a son of William and Frances John Garrettson. He was a farmer and stockman in Greene County for his entire life. He was a lifelong member of the Bates Fork Baptist Church, at Sycamore.

Surviving are his wife, Pearl Tharp Garrettson; one son, Dallas Garrettson, of Waynesburg, R. D. 4; two daughters, Wahneeta K., wife of Fred Orndoff, of Waynesburg, R. D. 4, and Evadeen, wife of Richard Ketchum, of Waynesburg, R. D. 1; four grandsons; two brothers, Harry Garrettson, of Washington, and Walter Garrettson, of Waynesburg, and one sister, Mrs. Georgie Tharp, of Brave.

One brother is deceased.
