Chocolate










Vegemite Spread




Rice




Parmesan Cheese


Tomatoes






Coca-Cola




Length of Your Ear (cm)

Comparison of Hand and Distance Between Nose and Chin








Your Waist To The Top Of Your Head (cm)

















Length base of your nose to your chin (cm)








Comparison of Foot to Radius













We thought Sydney had the best harbour in the world and the water was so clear we could see the bottom of the sea and everyone started singing, 'A Sailor went to Sea Sea, Sea.. That night I had a horrible dream about the strange people from Sydney coming and attacking the ship while we were all asleep, I woke up because I could hear the sound of fire crackling, I immediately rang the bell and everyone woke up instantly, they all came up on deck with pistols in their hands.

21st April 1770

This has been a dreadful day. Van diemens land wasn't as I thought it would be. The country was totally different from home and there were tall trees with ship shaped leaves. The trees had white bark!!

Disease and Death

12th June 1770

George finally died yesterday after having several fits. At Cape Tribulation the ship got holed and stuck on the Great Barrier Reef. In the middle of the night there were terrifying jolts and bumps. Mario went over board and banged his head on a sharp rock, he was lost at sea. The night was horrible.

16th June and the following weeks

We came to a river; the Endeavour was unloaded of fifty tons of guns, ammunition, ballast, even fresh water and wood, so we could make safe our passage. The days went past very slowly. Pettigrew died, I was very sad because he was my best friend; he died of scurvy and a fever that weakened him and drained the life from him.

6th January 1771

We stopped at Princess Island for supplies, but the water was bad and many men got dysentery. Ravenhill committed suicide by jumping from the boat's mast. I am disturbed aboard the Endeavour with all of my friends disappearing. In the middle of the night there was a huge wave and the hammocks nearly fell off their hooks.

30th January to 26th February

It was a tragic few days eleven crew died, then seven in the next week and three in the next two weeks. On board we are afraid because of all the diseases and it is also infested with rats and mice, which makes things worse.

This afternoon a sailor shouted land ahead. It was the mainland of Southern Australia. I told the last few sailors to load the lifeboats and, row to shore. I jumped out of my boat and I heard a squeaky sound. It was the sand. The sand was so fine and white, every sailor started jumping on the sand. A smart sailor shouted, over grown rat, over grown rat. I went and I saw a large rodent, hopping on the squeaky, white sand. The next second we saw hundreds more, hopping our way. One rat scratched my face.

The sailors and I went climbing. Then I saw a hairy miniature bear climbing with a baby on its back. Everyone was screaming and the bears were asleep eating leaves on a Eucalyptus tree.

My men and I went around the woods and made a camp in the middle of nowhere. We all had to squash up in one little driftwood made house that my men had quickly built.

Ox-Bow: When I lost one of my best friends Nicholas Langridge and I was very sad. But I still see him.


