Chinese New Year

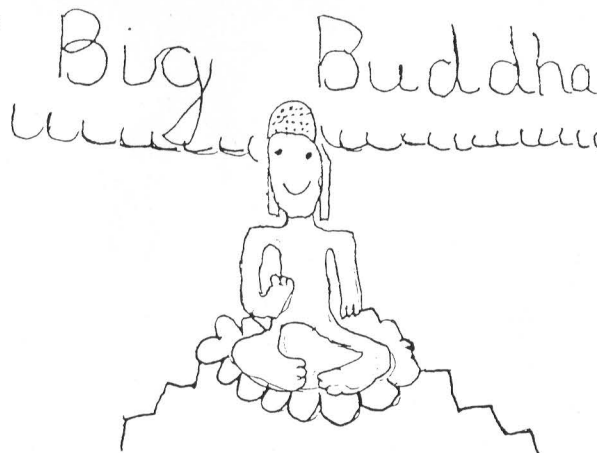

Our Picnic at Tai Tam

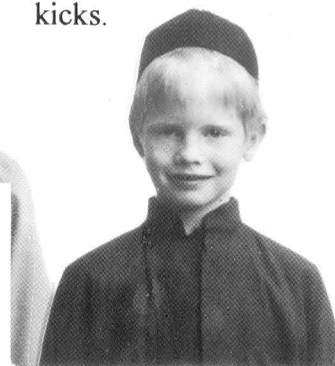

Archimedes

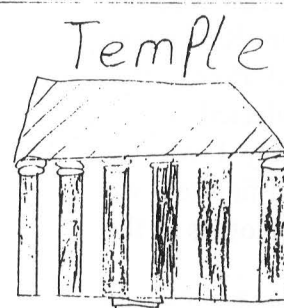

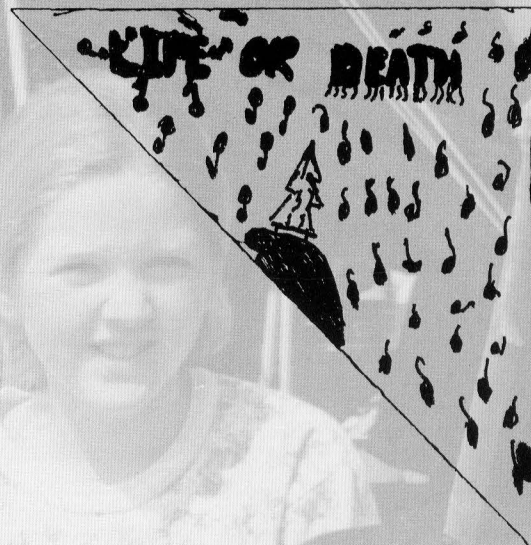
What Camp was Really Like!

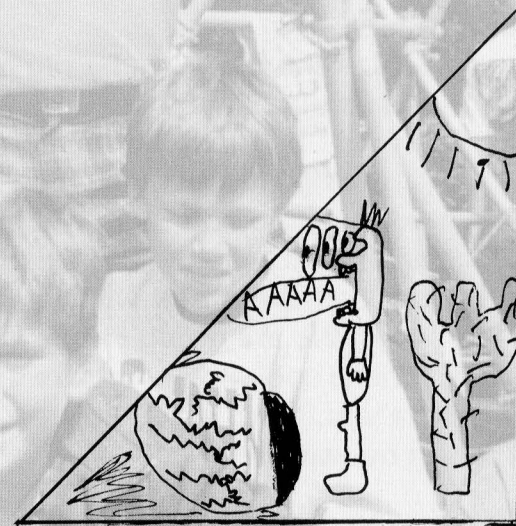
Day One

Almost six years ago was the last time I went to Kellett as a student and, although I can't remember my last day, many things in my mind still stand out.

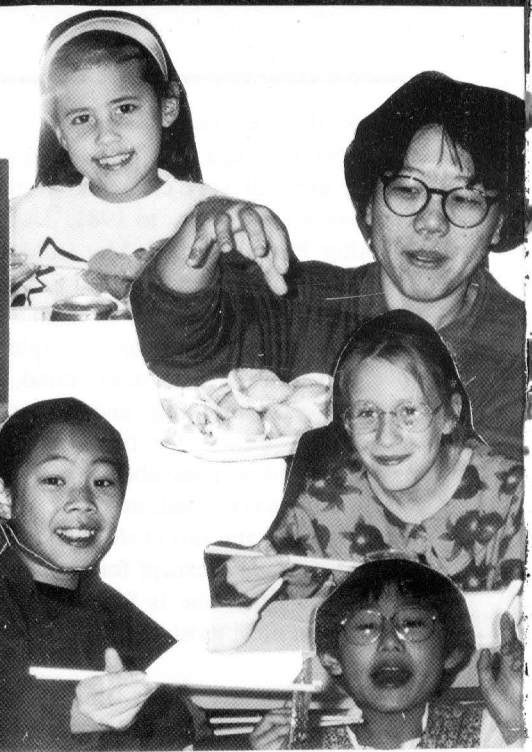

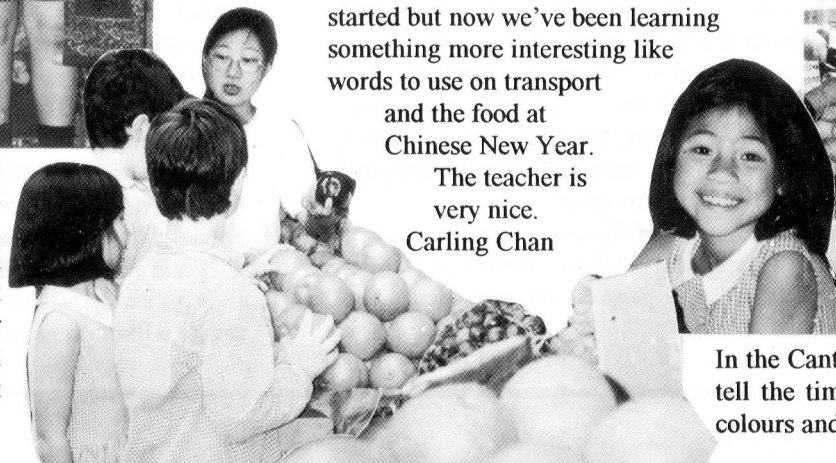


In the Cantonese Club we have learnt how to tell the time, how to answer the phone, the colours and lots more.
