It is always a great pleasure to open the new edition of the school magazine and share the memories of the school year, and I am sure that you will find much enjoyment while reading your latest copy.

This edition again illustrates the varied and exciting curriculum and reflects the children's enthusiasm for learning. The drawings and paintings accompanied by the range of comment, observations, description and stories which are contributed by each class, frequently illustrated by photographs, remind us of the topic work and first-hand experiences of the children's year. The photographs of the art, craft and CDT work, of the concerts and assemblies, of the sports, physical education and school teams, and of local visits and camps all illustrate the breadth and quality of school life. Also recorded are some of this year's highlights, such as the visit of Roger McGough, the Hallowe'en activities and the opening of the school bookshop.

One of the important aspects of Kellett has always been the close liaison between parents and school, so valuable in the support it gives to the children and the curriculum. Our magazine demonstrates this close co-operation through the many parent faces shown not only at the camps, on excursions and at the family sports day, but also at this year's fund-raising activities such as the Easter fair and the barndance.

Parents visiting Kellett, when selecting a school for their children, ask about our philosophy, about our facilities, about our priorities and what children will learn. Waiting at London Airport recently for a delayed flight, I picked up a book called *All I Really Need To Know I Learned In Kindergarten*. This provided appropriate reading matter for my flight and also food for thought. What are the priorities for a meaningful life if children don't begin by learning the things that Robert Fulghum learned at kindergarten:

Share with others.
Play fair.
Don't hurt people.
Put things back where you found them and
clear up your own mess.
Don't take things that aren't yours.
Say sorry when you hurt someone.
Live a balanced life — learn some, think some,
draw and paint and sing and dance and play and
work some, every day.
Be aware of wonder — remember the little seed
in the polystyrene cup.
Goldfish, hamsters and little seeds all die.
Remember to look.
And, finally, when you go out into the world, watch out
for traffic, hold hands and stick together.



Our children come from many countries, from many nationalities, and have different experiences to draw on. The delightful pages of photographs on pages 18 and 19 confirm this. The fact that they can all co-operate to work, play, learn and share their lives at Kellett so successfully is a good basis for life in our international community.

My sincere thanks go to the children for their contributions, to the staff for all their hard work, to the parents who support in so many ways, and my special thanks and congratulations go to the magazine committee for this excellent edition.




In The Cave

Mr Miller has won many medals, certificates and cups for playing sports.





THE INTER STELLA ROCKERY




HOMEWORLD BOUND



LE FROMAGE

Sir Henry Kellett



Vice-Admiral Sir Henry Kellett was born in 1806 in Ireland. He joined the Royal Navy when he was 16 years old as a midshipman. He travelled the world and, on one occasion, his ship, the *Resolute*, was stuck in pack ice near the North Pole and he and his crew had to abandon ship and walk for two weeks over the ice before they were picked up by another ship.

Kellett commanded two ships in his time, the *Starling* and the *Herald*. He took part in the Opium War against China in the early 1840s in the *Starling* and carried out mapping work along the coast of South America in the *Herald*.

He returned to China and Hong Kong from 1869 to 1871 and many places in Hong Kong are named after him and his ships. He died at his family home in Ireland in 1875.
