## From The Principal,

This year, as we complete five years in our own building, has proved again to be a busy one.

The September term opened with a full complement of almost 380 children and a staff of 32. Once the Reception children were settled, we invited all their parents in for a curriculum evening. Primary I parents attended afternoon sessions on 'Learning to Read', and we also had an excellent attendance at the parents' computer evening. November brought the Annual General Meeting, the very successful Night Market and the publication of our superb cookbook, "Kids' Kitchen". We were able to reap the benefit of the enthusiastic fund-raising when the stage lights were installed in good time for the four Christmas concerts, where we all caught the Christmas spirit in readiness for mince pies, parties and a visit from Father Christmas.

The January term found everyone busy with magazine work and brought an exciting range of opportunities, from celebrating Chinese New Year, to visiting concerts, the Dinosaur Exhibition, the Queen Elizabeth II, the naval fleet and the Space Museum. March was a month for the sporting, with the inter-schools mini-rugby, football and netball tournaments. The Parents' Committee were fund-raising again with the Kellett School Party.

The short summer term began with a sporting flavour too, as all the children prepared for the Family Sports Day at Stanley Fort. As June arrived, thoughts turned first to next year's intake with all the three to four year olds invited for weekly library sessions and somewhat sadly to the children who will leave us for secondary schools. The Primary VI children bid us farewell with a concert-supper night for teachers and parents.

Sitting down to write this introduction, I spent a few minutes looking through the last magazines, inevitably stopping to look at the class photographs from the first magazine in 1982. It struck me very forcibly just how many of the children from among those smiling faces had left us for new schools in many parts of the world — in fact less than a quarter can be found among this year's photos. I hope they all still have their copy of 'Kellett' to help them enjoy looking back at their years in the school. I feel sure this selection of drawings, paintings, photos and written work will provide a delightful reminder of the many activities of 1984/85 for both children and their families.



Congratulations to the teachers, the Magazine Committee and of course the children for producing again such a splendid magazine. Thanks to their imagination, time and energy we can all enjoy a very varied and exciting edition of 'Kellett'.

I would like to say a special thank you to all the parents who support the school in many different ways: the school governors, our regular helpers who come in weekly to help in classrooms, library, resources area or medical room, the many mothers who attend workshops and arrange fund-raising projects and those who work with the children at Saturday Sports, Cubs or Brownies. It is this positive feeling with parents and teachers working together in the best interests of the children that makes Kellett such a special place.

I like coming to cubs because we play really good games.


My favourite game is diving for pearls.





This monster has wings on his arms and he lands on his feet then bounces along. His ears are on top of his head. He was born with one ear bigger than the other.




## SPORTS

## ADVENTURE ISLAND



The taro root is also edible. The plant has large heart-shaped leaves so it is easy to identify. The root has to be cooked before it can be eaten.

Sweet potatoes, yummy, you can eat them raw or cooked. The plant is like a vine. There is a lot of bamboo on Adventure Island. It is good to eat raw or cooked.

There are coconut trees, the milk of the coconut is good to drink, they are difficult to open!

Sometimes we were able to eat fish if we were on a beach. These would have to be barbecued.

My ears are pierced and I normally wear gold plated earrings to school in the shape of a star.


I am short for my age, I am ten. I am also very small, everyone calls me a shrimp or a midget. I think I am the shortest in the class.

Sometimes it makes me so sad I start to sob a little.




We always have to go to school. If you don't there's trouble. We always get homework. Our teachers always tell us what to do, we don't get to choose.

"Okay mum."






Me, Myself, I






## Me, Myself, I


You also have to go to school at 9 o'clock, while you are still sleepy. (Who ever thought that it was sensible to go to school at that time must have been nuts)..
