## FOREWORD

Major changes are taking place in almost every phase of education across the nation. Stimulated by the space program, extensive studies are being made to re-examine the total curriculum from the basic psychological principles of learning to the publication of new texts. Many of these studies are being supported by the National Defense Education Act, and by federal and private grants, while others are being undertaken by local groups similar to Millburn's Curriculum Development Program.

The accumulation of knowledge in recent years has indicated that the traditional curriculum must be supplemented and, in some instances, replaced by new and significant material. This expansion, as it continues, will provide a body of information which is too much for a student to learn. Therefore, throughout the country, emphasis is being placed on thinking and reasoning, the development of concepts, and the processes of inquiry and experimentation.

The Board of Education, the administration and the teachers in Millburn are keenly aware of the impact these developments will have upon our schools. The articles contained in this bulletin describe the preparations we are making to meet this challenge.

We wish to express our sincere appreciation to the Board of Education, teachers, department heads, principals and all who contributed to the publication of this bulletin.

# BUDGET REPORT

## for the 1964-1965 school year

### MILLBURN PUBLIC SCHOOLS

February, 1964

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### THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

A school budget is a financial plan for providing an instructional program that will continue to meet the challenges of our times. We strive to accomplish this in a school system which consists of seven elementary schools, a junior high school, and a senior high school, with a student enrollment of 3,937 and a professional staff of 212 teachers, 9 principals, 2 vice principals, 4 central office administrators, and 14 additional professional employees who offer auxiliary services.

The curriculum is constantly being improved and new textbooks and instructional equipment are being purchased in order to provide a quality educational program for all of our students. Perhaps one measure of the quality can be seen in last year's senior class. From a total of 281 seniors, 244 or 87% were accepted by colleges and institutions of higher learning.

The proposed budget for 1964-1965 has been under study for many months and is the reflection of careful thinking by your Board of Education and administrative staff. They have considered the requests and recommendations of teachers, principals and curriculum commissions regarding every phase of the instructional program. Each item was considered on its own merit and in its relation to the total instructional program. As a result of these deliberations, the Board approved what it considers essential to support the outstanding features of our present program and to make possible the necessary changes to meet the demands of a modern curriculum.
