

Erle Mills, Former Chief Clerk Here, Dies in Calif.

Erle R. Mills, for six years chief clerk for the Bureau of Reclamation in Boulder City, died recently in California after a short illness, according to word received by U.S.B.R. officials here.

Mills, who was chief clerk for the Boulder Canyon project from 1930 to 1936, during the dam construction days, had been with the Reclamation service for 38 years.

When he left Boulder in 1936, he was transferred to the Central Valleys project, and had been stationed at Sacramento from then until his death.

Mills is survived by his wife and his son, Morgan Mills.
